Be It Hereby Directed, that the Tax Warrant of this Board duly signed shall be affixed to the above described tax rolls authorizing the collection of said taxes to begin September 14, 2009 to October 16, 2009 and also February 15, 2010 to April 9, 2010 giving the Tax Warrant an effective period of two hundred eight (208) days at the expiration of which time the tax collector shall make an accounting in writing to the Board, and

It Is Further Directed, that:

2009-2010 SCHOOL TAX is due September 14, 2009 and may be paid in full without penalty or interest until October 16, 2009.

This tax may be paid in two equal installments as follows:

FIRST INSTALLMENT from September 14, 2009 to October 16, 2009 without penalty after which date a 2% penalty will be added and then 1% per month.

SECOND INSTALLMENT from February 15, 2010 to April 9, 2010 without penalty. SECOND INSTALLMENT MAY NOT BE PAID WITHOUT PENALTY UNLESS FIRST INSTALLMENT, INCLUDING PENALTY, HAS BEEN PAID OR IS PAID AT THE SAME TIME. ANY REMAINING UNPAID AFTER APRIL 9, 2010, SHALL BEAR INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 12% PER ANNUM. AN ADDITIONAL 5% PENALTY WILL BE ADDED ON ANY TAX REMAINING UNPAID AFTER APRIL 9, 2010.

TAX WARRANT

TO THE COLLECTOR OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE TOWN OF GRANBY, OSWEGO, MINETTO, SCRIBA, VOLNEY, PALERMO AND THE CITY OF FULTON OF OSWEGO COUNTY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

Chapter 73 of the law of 1977 amended Section 1318, subdivision 1 of the Real Property Tax Law and provides that 4% of the current school year budget may be retained from the Unreserved Fund Balance.

YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED:

1. To give notice and start tax collection on September 14, 2009. (In accordance with the provisions of Sections 1324 and 1326 of the Real Property Tax Law.)
2. To give notice that tax collections will end on April 9, 2010.
3. To collect taxes in the total sum of \$18,398,608.00 in the same manner that collectors are authorized to collect town and county taxes in accordance with the provisions of Section 1318 of the Real Property Tax Law.
4. To make no changes or alterations in this tax warrant or the attached tax rolls but shall return the same to the Board of Education. The Board may correct its warrant and tax rolls because of errors or omissions in accordance with the provisions of Sections 550-559 of the Real Property Tax Law.
5. To forward by mail to each owner of the real property listed on the tax rolls within ten (10) days after the start of collections, a statement of taxes due on their property on pre-numbered tax bill forms provided by the school district in accordance with the provision of Sections 922 and 1338 of the Real Property Tax Law. To forward by mail, without interest penalties, to the office of the County Treasurer a detailed tax bill of all state land parcels liable for taxes on the school tax rolls in accordance with the provisions of Sections 540-544 of the Real Property Tax Law.
6. To receive from each of the taxable corporations and natural persons the sum listed on the attached tax rolls, without interest or penalties, when such sums are paid before the end of the first month of the tax collection period. To add 2% after October 16, 2009 and 1% per month to all taxes collected during the third month of the tax collection. This tax may be paid in two equal installments as follows:
FIRST INSTALLMENT from September 14, 2009 to October 16, 2009 without penalty after which date a 2% penalty will be

added and then 1% per month.

SECOND INSTALLMENT, from February 15, 2010 to April 9, 2010 without penalty.

SECOND INSTALLMENT MAY NOT BE PAID WITHOUT PENALTY UNLESS FIRST INSTALLMENT, INCLUDING PENALTY, HAS BEEN PAID OR IS PAID AT THE SAME TIME. ANY TAX REMAINING UNPAID AFTER APRIL 9, 2010, SHALL BEAR INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 12% PER ANNUM. AN ADDITIONAL 5% PENALTY WILL BE ADDED ON THE REMAINING UNPAID TAXES AFTER APRIL 9, 2010.

7. To issue pre-numbered receipts only on forms provided by the school district in acknowledgment of receipt of payments of taxes and to retain, preserve and file exact carbon copies of all such receipts as required by Section 986 of the Real Property Tax Law.
8. To promptly return this warrant at its expiration and if any taxes on the attached tax rolls shall be unpaid at that time, deliver an account thereof on forms showing by town the total assessed valuation, tax rate, the total tax levy, the total amounts collected and the total amounts remaining uncollected as required by Section 1332 of the Real Property Tax Law.

This warrant is issued and delivered in accordance with Sections 1306 and 1318 of the Real Property Tax Law. It is effective immediately after it is properly signed by a majority of the members of the Board of Education. This warrant shall be returned within twenty (20) days after the date which the last installment of taxes must be paid.
