

HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

Homebound instruction is a service provided to pupils who are unable to attend school due to medical, emotional or disciplinary problems. Secondary pupils receive instruction for a minimum of two hours per day and elementary pupils receive instruction for a minimum of one hour per day. Pupils receive credit for their work while on homebound instruction.

The district makes provisions for homebound instruction upon referral from the Physician or the Superintendent of Schools following established guidelines for placing a student on homebound instruction.

The Superintendent of Schools is responsible for developing guidelines for placing a student on homebound instruction.
